EXCITING NEWS FOR CHARTER HOUSE

We recently got some very good news for charter house. We had only been able to except people as a member if they had Medicaid insurance. Now we can except as a member anyone with a history of mental illness. We can now serve people with private insurance, people with Medicare, or people with no insurance.

Standard two from clubhouse international states that "the clubhouse has control over its acceptance of new members. Membership is open to anyone with a history of mental illness, unless that person poses a significant and current threat to the general safety of the clubhouse community."

Until very recently Charterhouse was unable to comply with this standard because we could only accept persons with Medicaid. Now all of that is changed. Our community mental health center (CEI CMHB) received a CCBHC Federal grant. This grant provides for the needs of persons who do not have Medicaid. A big thank you to Senator Debbie Stabenow for introducing legislation for this grant and also to Stacy Fox-Elster who spent long hours writing our grant proposal.

CLUBHOUSE TRAINING AT GENESIS CLUB > GEORGE H. & DIANE M.






